Immunization Section

Mission Statement

DSHS Immunization Section aims to eliminate the spread of vaccine-preventable diseases by increasing vaccine coverage for Texans, raising awareness of the diseases that vaccines prevent, and educating the public about vaccine safety.

Immunization Program Success

Texas Vaccines for Children Part 1

Texas Vaccines for Children (TVFC) 2024 success:

- 93% of TVFC providers reported to the Immunization Information System (IIS) in the last 6 months (25% increase).
- Since the rollout of the RSV vaccine:
 - 49,540 doses of the 50 mg presentation were provided to 1,185 providers.
 - 34,000 doses of the 100 mg presentation were provided to 1,160 providers.
- We recruited over 80 new hospitals.

Perinatal Hepatitis B Prevention Program

2024 accomplishments:

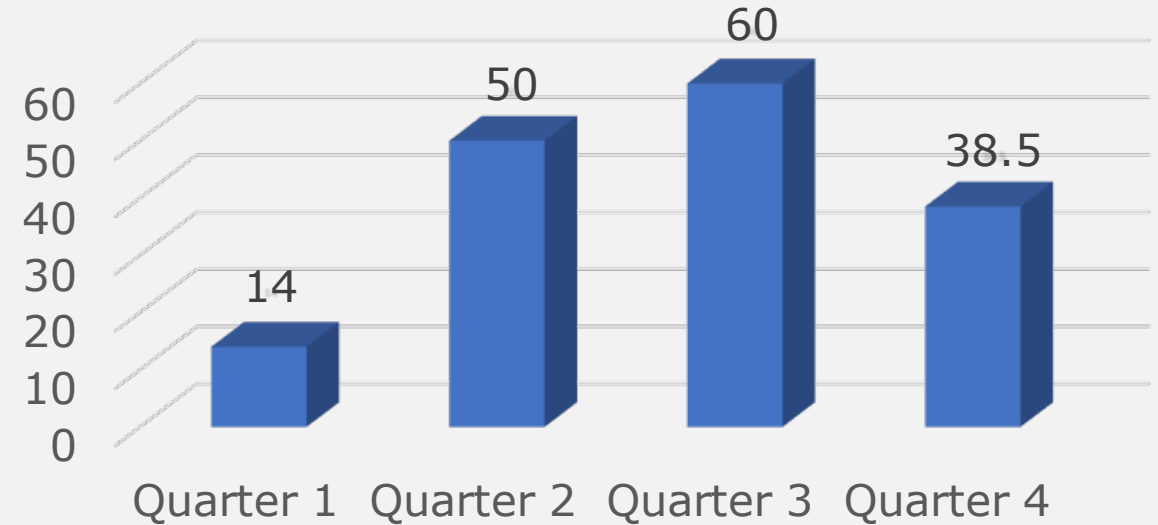
- Continued growth in the use of PHB Salesforce database
 - 100% of LHDs documenting case management in Salesforce (up from 88% in 2023)
 - 168 database enhancements made in 2024
- Improved data reporting capabilities
 - With 100% documentation in Salesforce, able to pull accurate, timely information
- Increased birth facility reporting into database via online reporting portal
 - Increased from 41% in 2023 to 57% in 2024

Immunization Program Success

Perinatal Hepatitis B Prevention Program Continued

- Focus on education and training for Regional Entities
 - Central Office provided 162.5 hours of education and support in 2024
- Support of jurisdictional changes
 - Dallas absorption of the City of Garland
 - Harris County managing PHB cases as of 9/1/24
- Successful two-and-a-half-day summit in May 2024
- Continuing nurse education in December 2024

Immunization Information System

Immunization Information System (IIS) successes:

2024:

- 2,828 new ImmTrac2 site registrations
- 13,055 ImmTrac2 site renewals
- Over 200 million HL7 messages sent to ImmTrac2

As of December 2024:

- 37,132 total organizations are enrolled in IIS
- 35,434 active ImmTrac2 users
- 9,816 providers participating in bidirectional data exchange
- Almost 19 million consented clients in ImmTrac2

Immunization Program Success

Community Outreach

- Community Outreach Success in 2024:
- Collaborated with more than 50 agencies
- Exhibited at nine conferences
- Shared materials with all Texas libraries and parks and recreation facilities
- Disseminated 3.8 million vaccination print educational materials
- Hosted more than 50 webinars
- Educational campaigns:
- Pediatric Campaign: More than 77 million impressions
- Teen Campaign: More than 26 million impressions
- Childhood Campaign: More than 77 million impressions
- Flu Campaign: More than 46 million impressions

Future Goals

Immunization Section

- Stabilize post-COVID and train new staff
- Program Goals
- Increase TVFC provider recruitment
- Increase the statewide child immunization coverage rate of the 4:3:1:3:3:1:4 vaccine series, as reported by the CDC's National Immunization Survey-Child (NIS-Child)
- Identify areas with low vaccination rates and work with partners to develop initiatives and increase vaccination rates
